IV. MAIN TOPIC ANALYSIS

The Garos are one of the various ethnic groups living in the North East of India. The Garos are a tribe that is different from other tribes settled in a matriarchal society.

A society is formed by the combination of men and women, but women play a major role in Garo society. Garo women do household chores , earn a living and raise their children. Because of the matriarchal society, while Garo women marry and they do not go to their husbands' houses. The husband should come and stay at the woman's house. In addition, children take their mother's surname.

All daughters inherit all the mother's movable and immovable property. There is no right for sons and children. Garo women also know how to handle household chores. The Garo women are skilled in weaving clothes, spinning, raising goats, pigs, chickens, collecting firewood from the mountains, gathering vegetables, selling vegetables in the market, growing rice, harvesting crops, etc. Despite all these things, women constantly try to satisfy everyone in the family. Garo women carefully perform the duties of raising their children, providing proper education, and helping their husbands. Garo women from low-income families have also tried to do everything with great difficulty. Garo women are also pioneers in agriculture along with the men, women go out to the mountains in the morning to cultivate jhum. Women clear forests to cultivate jhum, spray good seeds on paddy fields etc. Again, women do the same amount of work as men in harvesting, threshing, and bringing rice from the mountains during the ripening season. Apart from these, the Garo women, despite tying their children in back, take the lead in the work of fetching firewood from the hills, growing vegetables, selling vegetables in the market, etc.

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Garo women take care of all the household chores and are involved in social activities. Women also take the lead in any disaster in someone's home, the birth of a child or auspicious rituals. When a person dies, women take responsibility for purifying the body before burial. The woman of the deceased should take responsibility for this work. All the work related to childbirth is done by women. In Garo society, only women have the right to make all decisions in marriage. The marriage course is completed only if the woman of the house decides to marry with the consent of the family.

Every village of the Garos has a Nokma (Chief). This Nokma could only be a woman. It was only under the leadership of Nokama that the people of a village lived peacefully. On the day of the Nokma election, every woman dresses beautifully in their traditional costumes.

Since the Garo society is a mother centric society, women are ahead of men in all aspects. In today's society, there are various incidents happening about women: Indecent gestures indecent behaviour, rapes etc. are seen to be less in the garo society. The main reason for this is that the garo women are mentally or physically very strong.

In case of wrongdoing, not only all the perpetrators are informed, but all are punished accordingly. He lets the oath to be made so that no man would look misbehavly at the woman in future. Men are always aware of such harsh guidelines. So the place of women in the garo social system is ahead of men. The contribution of rural women in all fields is very high because of the management of the matriarchal society system.

V. CONCLUSION

A woman is the main force of a society. Women are needed as much as men are needed to form a society. Note that women are more supreme in all activities. In order to maintain the supremacy of women, first all women need to educated. Because no woman will be able to come forward to rule the society if she is inside the house. Now girls from Garo society are also seen stepping out with the same education as boys. By receiving appropriate education, through family support, becoming economically independent, black women can be seen to be making progress.

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
